Twelve Tips for Spring

1. If you're still thinking about growing row crops this year, input supplies are limited, so reach out to our Pioneer Salesman Jim Tom Galbreath (606) 845-1821 or Hinton Mills Cynthiana Manager Dwight Leslie (859) 234-2122 right away.
2. It's still not too late to soil sample. Soil sampling is always a beneficial thing to do because it can save you money by allowing you to apply the right fertilizer and chemicals at the right rates.
3. Make sure the ground temperature is 55 degrees or above before you start planting corn or soybeans or spraying. 45 degrees or higher is okay when using a low vol herbicide.
4. Schedule spreading and spraying ahead of time. We already have a waiting list. Spring is a very busy time at Hinton Mills, and if you don't schedule in advance, you could lose time and money because you're waiting on your ground to be fertilized or sprayed.
5. An application of 1 qt./acre of 2,4D at least 21 days before you plant corn or soybeans will help tremendously with resistant weeds by allowing you to start with a clean field.
6. Shallow planted corn runs a higher risk for late-season lodging, developing a potassium deficiency and slower development. Make sure your planter's row closers are fully operational, because if they are not, you could be accidentally planting shallower than you intended.
7. Cattle prices are up. In terms of hay & pasture, it's still very economical to fertilize and control weeds as needed, because your return will be both time and cost efficient.
8. Spring forage seedings need to be in the ground by April 15th if possible. For cool season grasses, it may be best to wait until fall. Attempt to finish seeding any alfalfa by the end of April.
9. Start scouting for alfalfa weevil. 4 to 5 weevil per plant justifies an insecticide application that costs about \$8 per acre for your chemicals and will extend the stand life.
10. Flash graze pastures newly seeded with clover to reduce grass competition.
11. Continue to feed high mag mineral and start fly control. With high cattle prices it is even more important to protect your investments.
12. Our garden plants and seed supply vary by location. Many of the plants come from farmers near by each location and our availability changes as they have products ready. We encourage you to stop by and see.

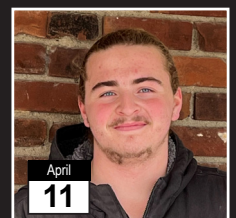

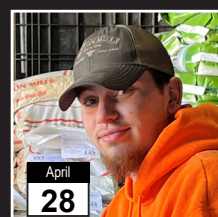
